

LIVE LIKE YOU WERE DYING – Pt. 5
“Embrace Eternity”
April 20, 2008

Luke 12:13-21

“Then someone called from the crowd, “Teacher, please tell my brother to divide our father’s estate with me.”

[14] Jesus replied, “Friend, who made me a judge over you to decide such things as that?” [15] Then he said, “Beware! Don’t be greedy for what you don’t have. Real life is not measured by how much we own.”

[16] And he gave an illustration: “A rich man had a fertile farm that produced fine crops. [17] In fact, his barns were full to overflowing. [18] So he said, ‘I know! I’ll tear down my barns and build bigger ones. Then I’ll have room enough to store everything. [19] And I’ll sit back and say to myself, My friend, you have enough stored away for years to come. Now take it easy! Eat, drink, and be merry!’

[20] “But God said to him, “You fool! You will die this very night. Then who will get it all?”

[21] “Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God.”

1. He lived like this life is all there is

This is a fatal miscalculation

1 Cor. 15:19

“And if we have hope in Christ only for this life, we are the most miserable people in the world.”

Eccles. 3:11

“God has made everything beautiful for its own time. He has planted eternity in the human heart, but even so, people cannot see the whole scope of God’s work from beginning to end.”

Eccles. 2:18

“I hated all the things I had worked for here on earth, because I must leave them to someone who will live after me.”

2. He lived like there would always be more time

This is a costly procrastination

This is a missed preparation

2 Cor. 4:17-5:1

[18] So we don’t look at the troubles we can see right now; rather, we look forward to what we have not yet seen. For the troubles we see will soon be over, but the joys to come will last forever.

[5:1] For we know that when this earthly tent we live in is taken down—when we die and leave these bodies—we will have a home in heaven, an eternal body made for us by God himself and not by human hands.”
